Subject Matter Requirement/CSET

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The Subject Matter Requirement (SMR) is required by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) for anyone seeking a teaching credential in California. By meeting the SMR, you demonstrate proficiency in the subject matter area of their intended credential.

When do I need to meet the Subject Matter Requirement?

It varies based on your credential program and school employer. Some teaching credential programs require the SMR prior to program enrollment. You should contact the teaching credential program you're considering to see what their deadline is. The SMR may also be required as a condition of employment. You should contact the school district you're considering for more information.

How can I meet the Subject Matter Requirement?

You must satisfy one of the following options:

- 1. [MOST COMMON OPTION] Pass the appropriate CSET with a minimum score of 220 on each subtest. For example, if you are working towards a Multiple Subjects Credential, you need to pass the CSET: Multiple Subjects. Click here to learn about Study.com's CSET test prep materials.
- 2. Earn a bachelor's degree or higher from a regionally-accredited university in the subject sought on the credential (NOT APPLICABLE TO RIVET SCHOOL GRADUATES BECAUSE OF OUR DEGREE OPTIONS)
